QUESTIONS FOR ORAL ANSWER*

- *1. **Mr Inderjit Singh:** To ask the Minister for Finance (a) what is the rationale for the billion-dollar investments by GIC and Temasek Holdings in distressed banks like UBS and Merrill Lynch; (b) whether it was too early to make such investments especially since the full effect of the sub-prime crisis has yet to be quantified; and (c) whether he can assure the House that Singapore will not lose the money pumped into these two banks or its standing internationally.
- *2. **Mdm Halimah Yacob:** To ask the Minister for Finance whether the Government will consider introducing additional measures to assist low income Singaporeans who are finding it difficult to cope with the rising cost of living with the high rate of inflation which is projected to increase even further this year.
- *3. **Ms Irene Ng Phek Hoong:** To ask the Minister for Foreign Affairs for an assessment of the ASEAN Summit and an update of the major initiatives discussed and agreed upon, such as the ASEAN Charter.
- *4. **Ms Irene Ng Phek Hoong:** To ask the Minister for Foreign Affairs (a) why did ASEAN heed Myanmar's last minute request not to allow UN special envoy Ibrahim Gambari to brief the East Asia Summit although this was earlier announced; and (b) whether ASEAN's credibility has suffered as a result of its handling of Myanmar at the ASEAN Summit.
- *5. **Ms Irene Ng Phek Hoong:** To ask the Minister for Foreign Affairs what was ASEAN's response to Myanmar's assertion that it did not welcome ASEAN's diplomatic efforts and if it meant that regional diplomacy is now irrelevant.

- *6. **Mr Sam Tan Chin Siong:** To ask the Minister for Health (a) what has been the inflation in health care cost over the past one year; (b) what are the main factors driving this increase; and (c) what plans does the Ministry have to help the lower income Singaporeans deal with these increases.
- *7. **Ms Eunice Elizabeth Olsen:** To ask the Minister for Health (a) whether low income patients have been paying more in medical costs given that the increase in aid applicants to Medifund is greater than the increase in Medifund payouts and that medical inflation has outstripped the national inflation rate; and (b) whether means testing will result in lower medical costs for low income patients.
- *8. **Dr Muhammad Faishal Ibrahim:** To ask the Minister for National Development with the rising prices of new and resale HDB flats, what plans does the Government have to ensure that home ownership continues to be affordable for lower income families.
- *9. **Dr Ong Seh Hong:** To ask the Minister for National Development whether he can provide the rationale for the shift from providing affordable housing to the Design, Build and Sell Scheme flats in Boon Keng, with some costing as much as \$700,000, especially with the income ceiling being fixed at \$8,000 a month.
- *10. **Ms Eunice Elizabeth Olsen:** To ask the Minister for National Development whether his Ministry will consider raising the income ceiling of \$8,000 for the purchase of HDB flats under the Design, Build and Sell Scheme.
- *11. **Ms Denise Phua Lay Peng:** To ask the Minister for the Environment and Water Resources whether his Ministry has plans to (i) regulate the street hawkers at the Sungei Road vicinity so that problems caused by illegal hawkers are reduced; and (ii) work with relevant agencies to set up a proper flea market at Sungei Road.
- *12. **Mdm Ho Geok Choo:** To ask the Minister for the Environment and Water Resources what is (i) the recent survey results with regard to business attitude towards climate change; and (ii) the Ministry's programme on reaching out to Singapore businesses on this subject.

- *13. Mr Edwin Khew Teck Fook:** To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Law (a) with the completion of the UN Climate Change Conference in Bali, what will be Singapore's strategy with regard to the negotiation of a climate change protocol post-2012; (b) whether Singapore will play a lead role as the chair of ASEAN to facilitate a common ASEAN position or independently negotiate a position that fits what is best for Singapore; and (c) how can the private sector and NGOs in Singapore assist the Government in this process prior to the Copenhagen meeting in 2009.
- *14. Dr Lim Wee Kiak:** To ask the Minister for Community Development, Youth and Sports in light of the Dragon Boat accident in Cambodia (a) whether the Ministry will review the safety rules for Singapore rowers when participating in international events and, in particular, ensure that it is compulsory for all rowers to have basic competency in swimming; and (b) whether the Ministry will consider mandating that National Sports Associations (i) avoid participating in events where international safety standards are not complied with; and (ii) provide compulsory insurance coverage for our athletes participating in international events.
- *15. Mrs Jessie Phua:** To ask the Minister for Community Development, Youth and Sports in light of the recent Dragon Boat incident, whether as a general rule the Singapore Sports Council mandates compulsory insurance coverage for all national athletes and if not, what steps are being taken to address this.
- *16. Assoc Prof Kalyani K Mehta:** To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs what plans does his Ministry have for curbing the rampant gambling and prostitution activities in the Geylang area as the efforts so far do not seem very effective.
- *17. Ms Ellen Lee Geck Hoon:** To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs (a) what is the number of reported cases of online cheating scams in the past 2 years; (b) what is the number of these reported cases where the culprits were arrested; (c) what are the measures undertaken by the police to detect and prevent such online scams; and (d) whether the police works with Interpol or other agencies as these crimes often involve an element of extra-territoriality.
- *18. Mr Siew Kum Hong:** To ask the Minister for Finance (a) what was the actual amount of additional GST revenues collected from July to December 2007, resulting from the increase in GST rate from 5% to 7% from 1 July 2007; and (b) what was the total amount of GST Credits paid out in 2007.

- *19. **Er Lee Bee Wah:** To ask the Minister for Manpower in view of the need for employers to provide mandatory medical insurance for their foreign workers (a) what will be the impact of this insurance policy on the utilisation of our hospitals and outpatient facilities to meet the demands of these workers; and (b) what safeguards are in place to prevent possible abuses of this insurance policy.
- *20. **Mr Siew Kum Hong:** To ask the Minister for Manpower in view of the first Workfare Income Supplement payment on 1 January 2008 (a) how many persons received this payment; (b) what was the aggregate amount paid under this first payment; and (c) what was the average amount received by each person.
- *21. **Ms Sylvia Lim:** To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs whether his Ministry will review or refine the classification of voluntarily causing hurt as a non-seizable crime, especially in cases where the victim has suffered injuries requiring medical treatment.
- *22. **Ms Ellen Lee Geck Hoon:** To ask the Minister for Defence what was the total compensation amount for those affected by the recent incident whereby civilian/public properties were damaged by the red dye as a result of an aerial military training exercise.
- *23. **Mr Chiam See Tong:** To ask the Senior Minister whether the Government has any plans to promote greater confidence in our market by introducing greater internal controls in public listed companies to check the powers of financial officers to single-handedly make big payments over a period of years, causing huge losses to their companies.
- *24. **Mr Siew Kum Hong:** To ask the Prime Minister whether the GDP Bonus for Ministers is awarded based on real GDP growth or nominal GDP growth.
- *25. **Mdm Halimah Yacob:** To ask the Minister for Health as one out of six Singaporeans are reported to suffer from some form of mental illness, whether the Ministry will consider reviewing the current exclusion of mental illness from MediShield's list of treatments and medical expenses.
- *26. **Ms Eunice Elizabeth Olsen:** To ask the Minister for Health whether the current Medisave balance of \$33,000 is enough to pay for 8 years of treatment, given a recent MOH survey that says Singaporeans suffer 8 years of poor health.
- *27. **Ms Denise Phua Lay Peng:** To ask the Minister for Finance in light of the recent massive data security breach in Britain, what specific steps is the Government taking to protect the confidentiality of client data in each Ministry.
- *28. **Mdm Cynthia Phua:** To ask the Minister for the Environment and Water Resources (a) how many stop-work orders were issued to building

contractors for pest infestation over the last 12 months; (b) what is the average period that contractors had to stop work in such cases and the average cost to the contractor for each day work is stopped; (c) what is the average amount of time taken to book and obtain a re-inspection of the worksite to lift the stop-work order; and (d) whether the Ministry has considered the potential conflict of interest if the team that handles the issuance of the stop-work order is also responsible for carrying out the re-inspection.

- *29. Mdm Ho Geok Choo:** To ask the Minister for the Environment and Water Resources if he is able to provide an update on the recent reinstatement of the Island-wide Cleanest Estate Competition and how will the Government ensure that there is a fine balance between the competition among cleaning companies and engaging residents to be more responsible for their own neighbourhood.
- *30. Mdm Halimah Yacob:** To ask the Minister for Community Development, Youth and Sports whether his Ministry will review the current stringent eligibility criteria for public assistance so that more needy Singaporeans who need long-term financial assistance will benefit from the Public Assistance Scheme.
- *31. Mr Seah Kian Peng:** To ask the Minister for Community Development, Youth and Sports in light of the rising food prices amongst other things (a) what is the Government doing to help those on the Public Assistance (PA) Scheme cope; (b) whether the PA Scheme takes into consideration the rising Consumer Price Index which is expected to escalate in the coming year and taking last year's inflation into account, the \$290 payout should go up to at least \$313; and (c) whether the Government has done any study on the spending habits of this group to determine how much they spend on food as a proportion of the PA received.
- *32. Ms Denise Phua Lay Peng:** To ask the Minister for Education (a) what are the registration criteria for private schools and special needs education centres; and (b) what can be done by the Ministry to clarify to consumers that registration does not equate to endorsement or recommendation.
- *33. Assoc Prof Kalyani K Mehta:** To ask the Minister for Education whether his Ministry has any new strategies or educational programmes planned to address the tripling of sexually transmitted infections among youths in the age group of 10-19 years in the last 5 years and, if so, whether he will elaborate on them.
- *34. Ms Ellen Lee Geck Hoon:** To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs in light of rising life expectancy and the encouragement for older Singaporeans to work longer (a) what is ICA's position with

regard to the maximum age for which a Singaporean will be allowed to apply for a permanent residence for his foreign wife; and (b) if his foreign spouse does not obtain permanent residence due to his failing to meet the age criterion, whether her Long Term Social Visit pass will be renewed indefinitely as a matter of course.

- *35. Er Lee Bee Wah:** To ask the Minister for Transport with the latest increase in Electronic Road Pricing charges at the Central Expressway (CTE) (a) what is the percentage of reduction in vehicular traffic that the Ministry hopes to achieve; and (b) does the Ministry expect an increase in traffic on the CTE during the year-end school holidays.
- *36. Dr Ong Seh Hong:** To ask the Minister for Health what is the average time frame before the \$300 claimable under Medisave for chronic disease management runs out and whether his Ministry will consider increasing the amount claimable, especially for Singaporeans with a larger amount of Medisave.
- *37. Dr Ong Seh Hong:** To ask the Minister for Health what is the turnaround time for an end-stage renal patient to receive subsidised treatment from the point of applying for the treatment.
- *38. Mdm Cynthia Phua:** To ask the Minister for National Development (a) how long does it take for newly married couples to get their new flats; (b) what is the waiting time for these newly married couples to apply for flats in the new estates in Punggol and Sengkang; (c) what is the waiting time if they were to apply for a three-room interim rental flat; and (d) what are the other alternatives for these couples.

Mdm Ho Geok Choo:** To ask the Minister for National Development given the expected demand for green lifestyles (a) how cost-sustainable is the construction of such neighbourhoods in the long term; and (b) can the Government maintain a stable supply of green technology and materials to be offered to residents at a low cost.

Mdm Cynthia Phua:** To ask the Minister for National Development in view of the new guidelines on dog licensing (a) how many applications for registration of pet dogs have been received; (b) how many licences have since been issued; (c) what is the average time for a dog licence to be issued from the date of application; and (d) what is the processing time for the issuance of new licences.

Mr Zaqy Mohamad:** To ask the Minister for Community Development, Youth and Sports in light of the recent dispute between triathlete Gino Ng and the Triathlon Association of Singapore (a) if he will provide an assessment of the issue in the selection of athletes to represent Singapore; and (b) what measures will be put in place to prevent similar disputes and

ensure the meritocratic selection of sportsmen by national sports associations to represent Singapore in international competitions.

- *42. **Mrs Jessie Phua:** To ask the Minister for Community Development, Youth and Sports (a) what is the number of foreign athletes recruited to date under the Foreign Sports Talents (FST) Scheme; (b) what is the number of FST recruits who have obtained Singapore citizenship; and (c) how many of these athletes are currently still in active training and representing Singapore.

- 1. Dr Fatimah Lateef:** To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Law whether there are plans to consider adopting a Good Samaritan law in Singapore and, if not, what are the reasons.
- 2. Dr Lam Pin Min:** To ask the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Home Affairs (a) whether the fire safety regulation stipulating a minimum of two independent exit staircases for every storey of a building applies to all residential and commercial buildings, including those built 30 – 40 years ago; and (b) whether there are existing buildings that do not meet this minimum requirement, and if so, what measures are in place to ensure safe fire egress in an event of a fire that affects the one and only fire staircase.
- 3.
