Dr Syed Harun serves in the Government of Singapore as Senior Parliamentary Secretary for the Ministry of Education (MOE) and Ministry of National Development (MND). He was first elected to Parliament in May 2025 as a member for Nee Soon GRC.

At MOE, his focus areas include mental wellbeing and special educational needs, and as Chairperson of Malay Language Learning & Promotion Committee. At MND, he focuses on rental housing, home ownership support and social support services, as well as engagements with the Built Environment sector.

He is co-chair of the Inter-Agency Taskforce for Heritage Businesses, Traditional Activities and Cultural Life aimed at supporting the sustainability local heritage and culture. He is co-lead of the Malay Muslim (MM) Youth Taskforce focused on engagement of MM Youth in career development, strengthening cultural identity and contributions at a national level. He is also a member of the Steering Committee for Mental Health and Well-being, the Inter-Ministry Committee on Drug Prevention for Youths and the Inter-Agency Taskforce on Assurance for Families with Persons with Disabilities.

Dr Syed Harun graduated from Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine in 2010. He was formerly a Consultant Psychiatrist active in both private and public practice. While he focused on General Psychiatry & Forensic Psychiatry, he maintained a keen interest in ensuring mental health remained accessible at the level of community. He is a Council Member of the College of Psychiatrists at the Academy of Medicine, Singapore.

He was named National Council of Social Services 40-under-40 in 2019, an ASEAN Youth Fellow in 2023 and a serving member of the National Youth Council from 2020 to 2026. He has previously held key leadership appointments in both charity and medical sectors, including as President of Lembaga Biasiswa Kenangan Maulud and as Honorary Secretary of the Singapore Psychiatric Association.

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
