Dr Syed Harun is a Consultant Psychiatrist and Medical Director of The Starfish Clinic of Psychiatry & Mental Wellness.

He read MBBS at Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine and attained Specialist Accreditation as a Psychiatrist in 2019. He is a Fellow of Academy of Medicine, Singapore where he is a member of the Sections of Forensic Psychiatry and Addictions Psychiatry under the College of Psychiatrists. He holds international memberships with the American Academy of Psychiatry and the Law (AAPL), American Psychiatric Association (APA) and Royal College of Psychiatrists, United Kingdom.

He was formerly a Consultant Psychiatrist at the Singapore Armed Forces (SAF), a Visiting Consultant Psychiatrist at the Departments of General Psychiatry & Forensic Psychiatry at the Institute of Mental Health, and an adjunct lecturer and clinical tutor with the Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine, Nanyang Technological University.
