Ms Foo Mee Har is a Member of Parliament for the West Coast Group Constituency (GRC) since 2011. She is the Chairman of the Public Accounts Committee of Singapore Parliament, as well as the Vice Chairman of the Government Parliamentary Committee for Finance and Trade & Industry. She is also a member of the Government Parliamentary Committee for Education.

Ms Foo is also the Chief Executive Officer of the Wealth Management Institute (WMI). WMI is Asia's leading education institute for the wealth and asset management industry. She brings over 30 years of experience in both the private and public sectors, including leading diverse portfolio of international businesses.
