ORDER OF THE DAY

- 1. CONSCRIPTION: *Motion made, and Question proposed (4th November, 1964)*, "That, in view of the seriousness of the situation which will affect the lives and properties of the people of Singapore following the pursuance of the present policy of military expansion and war by the Alliance Government, and the measures taken by the Central Government to coerce youths of Singapore to undergo military training, this Assembly calls on the Singapore Government to urge the Central Government to stop conscripting such youths for military service." — (Mr. Kow Kee Seng).

Amendment proposed (4th November, 1964): to leave out —

"the pursuance of the present policy of military expansion and war by the Alliance Government, and the measures taken by the Central Government to coerce youths of Singapore to undergo military training, this Assembly calls on the Singapore Government to urge the Central Government to stop conscripting such youths for military service"

and insert —

"Indonesia's policy of aggression and subversion, this House calls upon the Central Government to take all measures to secure the safety of the lives and property of our citizens, and for this purpose to give our youth proper military training to help defend the sovereignty of our nation". — (Deputy Prime Minister).
