QUESTIONS FOR WRITTEN ANSWER

- 1. Mr. J. F. Conceicao: To ask the Minister for Defence what is (a) the number of reports made to the Police between 1st January, 1967, and 31st December, 1967, of offences of
 - (i) rape under section 375 of the Penal Code;
 - (ii) incest against women under section 376A of the Penal Code; and
 - (iii) unlawful carnal connection under section 128 (1) (j) of the Women's Charter; and

- (b) the number of cases in each of the above-mentioned categories which resulted in prosecutions.
- 2. Mr. J. F. Conceicao: To ask the Minister for Social Affairs what is (a) the number of mothers who, between 1st January, 1967, and 31st December, 1967, requested the Social Welfare Department to make arrangements for the adoption of their children; (b) the number of such children who were illegitimate; and (c) the total number of such children for whom the Department successfully arranged adoption.
- 3. Mr. J. F. Conceicao: To ask the Minister for Health what is the number of cases coming to the attention of Government hospitals between 1st January, 1967 and the 31st December, 1967 of pregnancies resulting from the offences or alleged offences of (i) rape under section 375 of the Penal Code; (ii) incest under section 376A of the Penal Code; and (iii) unlawful carnal connection under section 128 (1) (j) of the Women's Charter.
