## **QUESTIONS FOR ORAL ANSWER**

- \*1. Mr. LEE CHOON ENG: To ask the Minister for Labour and Welfare what are the terms of reference of the Tripartite Consultative Committee set up for the three Services Unions; whether any, and how many, meetings have been held; and what has been the outcome of such meetings.
- \*2. Mr. Goh Tong Liang: To ask the Minister for Local Government, Lands and Housing if he will make a statement regarding the construction programme for agricultural roads in the Bukit Panjang electoral division.
- \*3. Mr. Goh Tong Liang: To ask the Minister for Education since when has Chinese been taught as a second language in English schools; whether he is satisfied with the progress made, and what steps he has taken or proposes to take to make the pupils interested in its study.
- \*4. Mr. LEE CHOON ENG: To ask the Minister for Health if he will make a statement on the progress of the negotiations between the Ministry of Health and the Unions of the Medical and Health Department on the claims for revision of salaries and conditions of service submitted by the Unions since 1956.

That this Assembly views with grave concern and is profoundly disturbed by the action of the Government of Singapore in deporting to China the following persons, hamely, Fong Siew Long, Wong Yih Ching, Chong Huan Teng, Lim Inn Ping, Neo Ho Lan, Tai Chew Seng and Bok Kai Weng, although the Government has full knowledge that these persons were born, bred and educated in Malaya, which term in law means the Federation of Malaya and Singapore, thereby depriving the aforesaid natural-born persons of Malaya of their inalienable rights of citizenship, whether of Singapore or of the Federation of Malaya, and therefore this House deplores and strongly condemns the Government for its high-handed and arbitrary act of banishing these natural-born persons of Malaya to China against their will.
